



Car Connoisseurs Cruise into Springfield and Raise Record Donation for Community Charities

New fundraising and attendance records are set at 11th annual ANPAC® Car Show for Kids



SPRINGFIELD, MO – (October 1, 2010) A picturesque fall day created a perfect backdrop for the record-breaking 283 car owners and almost 2,000 car enthusiasts that gathered at the American National Corporate Centre on Saturday, September 25th for the 11th annual ANPAC® Car Show for Kids, benefiting the United Way of the Ozarks. Car owners, corporate sponsors, spectators, vendors and volunteers helped raise \$23,227.24 for the organization, establishing a new fundraising record.

The 2010 ANPAC® Car Show for Kids was co-presented by Empire Bank and CHROME® specialty car insurance. Twenty-five corporate sponsors, including O'Reilly Auto Parts, Whole Hog Café, Clear Channel Radio, KY3, Inc. and Copart, Inc., also contributed to the 2010 show.

A constant line of the area's most stunning and unique show cars filed in to the American National Corporate Centre parking lot throughout the morning. By the afternoon, cars had completely filled all parking spots available in the lot reserved for the show and had to be directed to overflow parking on an adjacent lot. Sunlight glimmered across row



after row of specialty cars and trucks – impeccable Chevrolet Camaros (this year's featured car), pristine muscle cars, classic street rods, custom roadsters, vintage modified trucks, modern sports cars – just to name a few.



Spectators and car owners alike enjoyed live entertainment, prizes and giveaways, a silent auction, food and products from local vendors, a Guitar Hero tournament and a kid's carnival hosted by United Way agencies. New to the show this year was Gamin' Ride, a 38' mobile video game theater. Video game fans had the opportunity to experience the self-contained theater's top-of-the-line gaming equipment for free.
